Notes:

Our July offerings were within \$559 of budget.

For the year to date, we are almost on track for our offerings. YTD offerings are only \$2,600 or 1% below budget. (\$76 per Sunday).

Year to date disbursements are \$5,100 or 2% over the budget.

The net impact is our YTD deficit is \$7,700 over budget.

Our largest budget overruns this year are due to Parents Day Out largely due to unbudgeted equipment purchases and property expenses with an air conditioner and furnace replacement.

Year-to-date, our offering is up \$3, 850 from last year. However, allowing for 35 Sundays last year vs 340 this year, our weekly offering is up \$332 per week this year.

Council Highlights

Kathy Robinson offered devotions.

Approved the August Congregational Meeting minutes as well as previous council meeting minutes and monthly reports.

Approved new members (to be received soon) of Emilie Tipton, Brently Dickey, and Deanna Dickey.

The renovation project will proceed as soon as work permits are received from the city. It should only take 2-3 weeks, hopefully, to complete.

2019 Budget process is underway. All Council members are asked to submit and/or meet with Richard Koepper to discuss their budget needs.

Giving recently has been good. We are very close to meeting our monthly budget. We have had property expenses that have caused us to have to spend more money (last month a furnace had to be replaced). Thanks to the congregation for their faithful giving.

Process has begun to find nominations to the 2019 Council. The positions open are: (1) Officers (2-year term) – Treasurer and Secretary; Representatives (3 year term) – Social Ministry; Stewardship, Youth Ministry.

Finance: The Nomination Committee is being formed as we speak. There is also a search for a Social Ministry replacement for Larry Ecklund who has served so well these many years as the Chairperson/Coordinator.

Columbarium Update: the committee has decided to go with the Everest Columbarium from North Carolina. It will be a free-standing columbarium in the courtyard of the church; the committee will now begin working on the policies for which the columbarium will be using. Once other details are worked out, the order will be placed, and it will take a number of weeks until the columbarium arrives and is in place.

Time, Talent, and Treasures information is needed. Those forms will be printed soon for distribution to the congregation.

A separate mailing to the congregation will be offered soon about how they might be financially supportive (over and above what they are currently giving to the general budget) to help with the renovation plan. Details forthcoming.

The meeting was adjourned with the Lord's Prayer.

- Volunteers to help the day of the event. Food preparation is done this day and all through the event.


Help during the event making sure the food is stocked, drink coolers are filled, making sure all the members have candy outside as the kids trunk or treat.

Parish Nurse News...

<u>PREPAREDNESS</u>—Merriam-Webster dictionary defines *preparedness* as: the quality or state of being prepared.

Some things we can't prepare for but most things, we can! "Flu Season," being one of them! Medical providers in our area are already reporting *positive* test results for Influenza Type-B. This is occurring early which is a BIG warning sign that you and I should be on guard and prepared for "flu season." I suggest discussing the flu vaccination with your primary care doctor and with his/hers consent; take the flu vaccine.

According to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC), the United States experiences annual epidemics of seasonal flu. This time of year is called "flu season." In the U.S., flu viruses are most common during the fall and winter months. Influenza activity often begins to increase in October and November. Most of the time flu activity peaks between December and February, and can last as late as May.

PROTECTIVE ACTIONS: The CDC recommends a yearly flu vaccine for everyone 6 months of age and older as the

first and most important step in protecting against this serious disease. Stay away from sick people. Wash your hands to reduce the spread of germs. If you are sick with flu, stay home from work or school to prevent spreading flu to others. In addition, there are prescription medications called antiviral drugs that can be used to treat influenza illness.

WHAT SHOULD I DO TO PROTECT MY LOVED ONES FROM FLU THIS SEASON?

Encourage vaccination. Encourage medical evaluation for possible treatment with flu antiviral drugs. These drugs work best if taken within 48 hrs of onset of when symptoms start.
